## SPANISH 1-4

Course Information:

- World Languages department
- All levels are year- long courses
- Levels 1, 2 (CP1 and CP2), Levels 3 (honors and CP1), and level 4 (AP)


## SPANISH 1 CP1

Spanish 1 (CP1) introduces students to the basic concepts of the Spanish language, the cultures of Spanish speakingcountries, using all four skills-reading, writing, listening and speaking to achieve basic and meaningful communication.

## SPANISH 1 CP2

Spanish 1 (CP2) introduces students to the basic concepts of the Spanish language, the cultures of Spanish speaking-countries, using all four skills-reading, writing, listening and speaking to achieve the basic skills of communication.
This course needs permission from World Languages department chair. It is designed for students with learning disabilities or MAPS who are CP2 level students and could otherwise not succeed in the cp1 level class.

## SPANISH 2 CP1

## Spanish 2 (CP1) is a continuation of

 Spanish 1 CP1. Students will engage in further vocabulary study, sharpening their listening, reading, writing and speaking skills in Spanish and continue to learn about culture. Must complete Spanish 1 cp1 successfully, recommended with a C or above average.
## SPANISH 2 CP2

Spanish 2 (CP2) continues with the basic concepts of the Spanish language, the cultures of Spanish speaking-countries, and all four skills of meaningful communication.
Prerequisite: This is only open to students who successfully completed Spanish 1 cp2 level and permission of Department chair.

## SPANISH 3 CP1

Spanish 3 (CP1) is offered to freshman, sophomore, or junior students who successfully have completed Spanish 2 cp1. This course builds on expressions used in everyday life, and all four skills with a thorough review of grammar and usage.

## SPANISH 3 HONORS

Spanish 3 (HON) is a continuation of the Spanish 2 cp1 course that uses the Glencoe multi-media series: Asi Se Dice Level 3 textbook and electronic materials. It is recommended that a student have a $90 \%$ or above in Spanish $2 \mathrm{cp1}$ to qualify for the honors track. The course introduced basic readings in poetry and other literature as well as articles about cultural topics. More writing and projects are expected of the students.

## SPANISH 4 AP

Spanish 4 (AP)has been designed to prepare students for the AP exam. Curriculum focuses on the three communication modes: interpersonal, presentational and interpretive. This course is equivalent to the learning experience in a third-year college course.
