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Course Description: Yearbook, as a course, is responsible for producing a student-generated book that reflects the current academic year.

Students are graded on office decorum, aptitude in handling the online program provided by publisher, initiative in completion of work, ability to meet deadlines.

As the yearbook is a serious publication, students are expected to make every effort to meet deadlines and work with each other as needed. Much individual attention is provided by teacher, as students are at work on individual yearbook projects.

Academic Requirements:

- 1. Students are expected to attend the regularly scheduled class. In addition, students are also expected to make contributions beyond the classroom, to include photography, interviews, etc.
- 2. Students have the ability to access their work from any computer and are expected to do so when deadlines are to be met.
- Much emphasis is placed on writing, grammar usage, punctuation...the goal being accuracy!



- Students who enroll in Yearbook can expect to learn a very sophisticated publication program furnished by the publisher.
- Additional programs are used frequently, such as Indesign and PhotoShop.
